

2015 Youth Conference – Leadership Week

What a great 2015 Youth Conference! Fifty seven students from across Georgia educational filled week at the GA FFA / FCCLA provide benefits to their Center in Covington.

The purpose of the conference is to build and enhance teen leadership skills and for objectives of the participants to learn the role cooperatives play in the communities they serve. The leadership event is also designed to promote teamwork through a series of exercises, training and presentations.

According to Gale Cutler, chairman of the Georgia Co-op Council Board and Public Relations Coordinator with Georgia Electric

Membership Corp., the campers took part in activities and visited with local co-ops to help them participated in a fun and understand the common goal of cooperatives; to members that could not be obtained individually. The students learned that all co-ops are formed to meet the specific members, and are structured to adapt to member's changing needs.

> "These students are already peer leaders in their community, and we have the responsibility of teaching them how cooperatives play a pivotal role in helping their towns and neighborhoods grow and prosper," says Cutler. During the five-day conference students

engaged in activities such as the Congressional Insight Workshop to gain deeper understanding as to why involvement in the political process is vital.

The teens enjoyed a field trip to local cooperatives Godfrey Dairy in Madison and **Snapping Shoals EMC** in Covington.

Other highlights included personality assessments to teach students how to efficiently work with a range of personalities and "Co-op 101" presentations, where speakers discussed the cooperative business model, including history, organization, member benefits and current issues.
